GBWR now wishes to build on this success and having achieved further investment we are looking to recruit a Regional Development Officer, to lead on the development and delivery of the participation strategy across Wales. The successful candidate will join an active, passionate team with a strong work ethic and a commitment to building rich wheelchair rugby communities.

Great Britain Wheelchair Rugby (GBWR) is the National Governing Body (NGB) for the sport of wheelchair rugby in England, Scotland and Wales. In addition to the Great Britain team we have 22 teams across the country and we deliver programmes in Spinal Injury Units, military rehabilitation centres and as part of a growing number of charitable foundations such as those from major rugby clubs; we also have a national youth programme.

The ideal candidate will have considerable experience developing and delivering participation initiatives across disability sports. They will have a background in disability sport with a demonstrable experience in supporting clubs. It is also assumed that the individual would have strong interpersonal and communication skills, with the ability to influence at all levels.

This is a permanent position based, initially, on a 9 hour week (one-day per week) with a salary of £25k pro-rata.
